Two Brother Knights of Council 4375.... Gone too soon.... But dearly remembered...

**Bro. Wesley Jérôme Orr** Jan. 15, 1993 - Jan. 4, 2019 Bro. Lawrence 'Larry' Chittle

Oct. 30, 1946 - Jan. 30, 2019



On a cold January 9th, 2019 fellow Fire Rescue personnel placed the casket of the late Bro. Wesley Orr, 25, into the newly restored 1947 Mercury Windsor Ambulance that has been repurposed as a hearse, prior to a procession past Windsor Station 7 on Lauzon Road where an honour guard of fire personnel awaited. Sadly, Terry was

the first member of the Windsor Fire Rescue to make use of this modified vehicle. Moving testimony by his siblings, co-worker and mentors spoke of Wesley's love of life, adventure, hard work and his firefighter vocation. Mentor and co-workers Nick Nifrios, Dilan Little and John Devlin as well as siblings Dilon, Erin and Melanie shared awesome remembrances. Wesley girlfriend Meighen Boyd also shared, Wesley has indeed had a positive impact on those he touched.



Fr. Stan Fraser, Padre of the Windsor Fire Department shared in the service to a capacity crowd at Windsor Chapel. A vast attendance by uniformed 'first response' personnel was most moving as about 170 formed an honour guard. After the service. A 'walk past' the evening before, saw about 250 in uniform gather to honour Wesley. Sincerest condolences are



extended to his parents Terry and Louise Orr (nee Chauvin), his brother and sisters and to his grandmother Jeanne Orr (late Bro. Melvin (2017). As our faith assures us, late Bro. Melvin and others in the Orr and Cecile families welcomed Wesley's spirit. As the Canadian flag in this photo is at half-staff, as of press time, so is the flag at the Orr home and business.




