

A fond farewell to two well-known knights...



Brother Louis Reaume, who died on May 18, 2018 at the age of 80, will be remembered as someone who the entire K of C council was honored to have called a member for 44 years. Louis suffered with a lengthy battle with Supranuclear Palsy. He was the loving husband of Yvonne (nee Jacques) for 54 years and the son of the late H.T. 'Buster" and Loretta Reaume and son-in-law of the late Alfred and Jeanette Jacques. He is the father of Michael (Elona), Simone Reaume-Hayes (Phil), David (Stacey), Matthew (Cara) and Christopher (Laura). Louis will be remembered as a proud community booster via his 14 years serving on town council. At his funeral mass on May 23rd at Good Shepherd, homilist Fr. Gary Goyeau remembered him as a 'Good Man' with a focus on his faith and family. He and his father and Reaume Construction have indeed left their mark on Tecumseh. Louis supported the council through his community involvement and financially contributed to the Nicholas Point Club in its time of need. Leaving his funeral mass, former Tecumseh Mayor and S.K.
