



# A touch of our history as Council Honours a CHARTER Member ...

(The following was a address shared by J.Marcotte at the May 4th Awards Dinner).

Worthy Chaplain, Dear Fathers, DD Mike Hendricks, Faithful Navigator, Grand Knights, Sir Knights, Brothers Knights, Ladies, visiting brothers...

Toward the end of 1956 a group of men who, were at that time, members of Windsor Council 1453 and under the guidance of District Deputy Phil Bistany, our (to be) Charter Grand Knight Paul Cecile (former State Deputy) and others whose names are remembered in Tecumseh's history including such names as Bernard Dupont, Harry Campeau, Frank Derdaele, Dr. Paul Hemond, Rene St. Pierre, Msgr. Gilbert Pitre started recruiting and were successful in signing up 52 who formed the charter class. Their motivation, I suspect, was, that in recognition of the growing men's Catholic organization called 'The Knights of Columbus' launching one could be beneficial to the church and the community and was 'something larger than themselves individually'. The council was chartered as a bilingual council on April 7, 1957. (These notations were taken from our late Bro. and S.K. Louis Gouin as was recorded in our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Book).

Just fond memories remain from all but a few of these 52 Charter members as can be evidence by the historic

photo that now hangs in the St. Anne Library/Meeting room.

In 1957, a young gentleman, who had been an orphan was living with the Antoine Morand family at their dairy farm on Banwell Road. At that time, Banwell boasted the farms of the Morands, the Lachances and the Baillargeons. Ron recalls holding infants Bro. Ray Morand of Council 4375 who is here tonight with his wife Jean and also the late Bro. Marc Morand, , who died Dec. 24, 1928 and who had been a member of 8919 as well as Assembly 1789.

Prior to living with the Morand's on Banwell, Ron recalls growing up on a small farm in Woodslee and of being an alter server at St. John the Evangelist Church. He recalls the initial ritual when he became a knight in Belle River.

While on Banwell, Ron helped on the dairy farm, and then, worked at delivering milk as did Antoine 'Tony' Morand with whose family he was living at the time. Roy recalls in the 1929 era delivering milk for Twin Pines Dairy in a 1929 Ford Model A. Later in life, Ron made his livelihood working for Kenko Autmotive Supply Sales while travelling throughout Essex and Kent Counties serving various garages and automotive repair businesses. He became a partner with Frank Charette in that enterprise. In the 50's (and later owned the company). He recalls K. of C. events at the Shawnee Tavern. To this day, Ron has remained active in the order and summarizes his reason for doing so is that .... "It is a good charitable organization and that helping people met with the approval of his wife Donna". Along the way, Ron became a member of Riverside Council 4924 and more recently he is with St. Theresa Council 9793 where in the 2011-2012 fraternal year he was Knight of the Year under GK Nick Goebel. His Hon. Life Membership was signed Aug. 1 2016 by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. Being in sales, Ron's traits as a friendly and involved person had served him well and he has fine recollections of living in Tecumseh and then servicing clients here. He and his wife Donna are currently parishioners at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. Donna, we thank you for your support of Ron throughout his K of C involvement. Ron, as a council who is proud of its 62 year heritage, we thank you for your part in the inception of Council 4375 and remaining with the Order for 62 years hence.

At the outset, please Print a copy of this emailed Letter and present our request herein to your respective Council/Assembly during your May 2019 Meetings.

On **Sunday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 2019** at **2:00 PM**, a procession paying tribute to our 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Colour Guard will be held at Heavenly Rest Cemetery. These Sir Knights have graced us with their presence at countless parades, prayer services, funerals and special ceremonies over these past many years. Please join us as we thank our Colour Guard members, as they retire the current Regalia at the end of this fraternal year. The Parade will begin from St. Nicholas Macedonian Church, progressing through the cemetery to the Fr. McGivney site. Anyone wishing to join the procession is asked to meet at the

Macedonian Church at 1:30 PM to organize. We invite all 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Colour Guard members to attend in full Regalia; 4<sup>th</sup> Degree non-colour guard members to march in their tuxedos and social baldric; and 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree members to participate, carrying their Council Banners if they so choose. Any participant not in Regalia or Tuxedo are requested to come dressed in proper attire. Suits, Sports Jackets with dress slacks or Council Shirts with slacks, and K of C Baldrics are also acceptable. (Please no T-Shirts, shorts, running shoes or sandals – this is intended to be a formal event. If you should come dressed inappropriately, you will be asked to view the procession as a bystander.)

In addition to the procession, we will hold a Flagpole dedication ceremony at the Fr. Michael J. McGivney site. We are inviting all 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights, 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Knights and K of C Squires as well as all their families to come and participate in this celebration. Please bring lawn chairs. Water will be available, and we will have a photographer (DD District 10 Sammy Sleiman) who will take souvenir pictures of our members and their families if so desired, completely free of charge.

Heavenly Rest Cemetery, a member of the Catholic Cemeteries of the Diocese of London, is the final resting place of many Knights of Columbus and family members. In 2004 a project was undertaken to place a statue on this site. In 2005 a dedication ceremony was conducted, and the statue with a relic of Fr. McGivney was installed behind the St. Francis Mausoleum. Upon his canonization, this will become a shrine.

This year a new project has been initiated, with the intent of erecting a Flagpole behind the statue of Fr. McGivney. The flagpole will adorn a Canadian Flag throughout the year and on those days during which the funeral of a member of the Knights of Columbus is held, we will also fly a K of C flag thereon. Management at Heavenly Rest Cemetery has welcomed this proposal and has graciously offered to work with us, contributing half the cost of the flagpole, and absorbing all costs associated with lighting and installation at the site.

We are now looking to our membership for assistance. We are calling upon each of the Councils and Assemblies in the London West Diocesan Association to approve the donation of \$100 to this venture (as was suggested from the floor at the LWDA meeting). Let us be clear, this project is not to erect a flagpole at Heavenly Rest Cemetery; it is a project to honour our Brother and Sir Knights by flying a flag of our nation and on K of C member funeral days a flag of our Order, at the only cemetery in Ontario to host a monument statue and relic of Fr. Michael J. McGivney.


